
Continued from Page 1 proclamations from Washington, D.C., London, and Moscow have brought the European War to an official end.

On Victory in Europe Day or V-E Day, Germany unconditionally surrendered its military forces to the Allies, including the United States. On May 8, 1945 – known as Victory in Europe Day or V-E Day – celebrations erupted around the world to mark the end of World War II in Europe.

V-J Day, or Victory over Japan Day, marks the end of World War II, one of the deadliest and most destructive wars in history. When President Harry S. Truman announced on August 14, 1945, that Japan had surrendered unconditionally, warweary citizens around the world erupted in celebration.
